

PARLIAMENTARY NETWORK ON THE WORLD BANK

15 April 2011, Washington D.C. – The Board of the Parliamentary Network on the World Bank (PNoWB) has adopted a resolution on the World Bank energy strategy at the 2011 World Bank/IMF Spring Meetings

- 1. The World Bank is developing a new energy strategy, which places greater emphasis on:
 - distribution of electricity to poor and excluded communities in developing countries, especially in rural areas; and
 - environmental sustainability.
- 2. The PNoWB Board recognizes that the policy is controversial and wishes to:
 - encourage parliamentarians to debate the issue; and
 - build a dialogue between parliamentarians and the World Bank about its new energy strategy.
- 3. In April or May 2011, the Board will circulate draft parliamentary questions to PNoWB members and encourage them to ask their government ministers to explain their policies on:
 - whether the World Bank should change its energy strategy to invest (a) more in small, local and renewable electricity generation and (b) less in large-scale fossil fuel electricity generation;
 - the use of carbon taxes to reduce CO2 emissions;
 - their country's energy strategy and what policies they have to reduce or limit the growth of CO2 emissions; and
 - the transfer of technology to less developed countries.
- 4. The PNoWB invites World Bank officials working on the new energy strategy to review the answers to these parliamentary questions and comment on them.
- 5. The PNoWB will organize a videoconference for parliamentarians in partnership with the World Bank to discuss the new energy strategy, to be chaired by PNoWB Board Member Geri Müller, MP, Switzerland.
- 6. Geri Müller will report back to the PNoWB Board, which will then consider whether to hold follow-up activities such as videoconferences and discussions at the next PNoWB Annual Conference.
